THE COMMA !!

Use a comma to separate an introductory word, phrase, or clause from the rest of a sentence.

No, I did not see him.

When playing basketball, wear suitable shoes.

Because John could type, he was hired.

The comma may be omitted if there would be little pause in speaking: *By then I will be done.*

Use commas to set off words or groups of words that interrupt the flow of thought in a sentence.

The show, I believe, has been canceled.

Betsy, however, was sure of the answer.

Some other examples of interrupters are *moreover, I suppose, I think, nevertheless, on the other hand, and to tell the truth.*

Use commas correctly. Put a comma wherever it is needed.

(Commas required in EVERY sentence.)

4. Astronauts of course wear pressure suits.
