## What Is a Sentence?

A <u>sentence</u> is a group of words that expresses a complete thought.

A <u>sentence fragment</u> is a group of words that does not express a complete thought.

Stood on the balance beam (Who stood on the balance beam?) Most of the players. (What about most of the players?)
